Getting Your FTP Settings

You will need to have your FTP settings on hand in order to use Windows XP Network Places to access our ftp server.

Creating a Windows XP Network Place

Once you create a network place for your Web site, you can access your Web site folders in the same way you access any of your folders in Windows.

To Create a Network Place

1. In Windows XP, select Start > My Network Places, or if you are using classic desktop it should be located on the desktop itself. Double-click it.

2. Under the "Network Tasks" sidebar, select "Add a network place." The "Add a Network Place Wizard" displays.

3. Click "Next."



4. Select "Choose another network location" and click "Next."



5. Enter the Internet address for the FTP site: ftp://www.artisticstorydesigns.com
